Sick List - If you would like to add yourself, a relative or friend to the sick list you must complete a consent form, you can find them in the porch, and return it to the office.


Baptisms: Please complete the request forms and send to the office. You will be contacted to book a date.

CRIB OFFERING FOR FR LONG'S CHARITY

Once again, I would like to introduce you to my charity: '*Hoc Bổng Một Chút Thương*' (A Little Love Scholarship). I have been running this charity since I became priest. The purpose of this charity is to develop an educational program. Specifically targeted to underprivileged children. The children in Ben Tre, my hometown live in extreme poverty and harsh living conditions, they lack any opportunity for an education. We aspire to provide education to these underprivileged children in Ben Tre to ensure that they have a brighter future. To also give them hope. This school year 2023- 2024, we raised \$20.500, including £1.550 from our parish. We are currently providing scholarships to 273 pupils, 31 of which were paid for by us.
