◇ **Baptisms**: Please complete the request forms and send to the office. You will be contacted to book a date.


◇ **Parish Hall**: See website – there is an enquiry form that you can fill out and send to the parish office website, or telephone 0121 422 4865 to make an enquiry.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

Welcome to Mass this weekend as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. It is the Church's feast of thanksgiving for the gift of the Eucharist and the Sacrifice of the Mass. The Pandemic has made us to think again about the place of the Mass and the gift of the Holy Eucharist in our lives. As we slowly emerge from the challenges of lockdown, it is a great sign that many people feel able to take up again the practice of coming to Sunday Mass. It shows how important the gift of the Eucharist is to us as a people of faith. The livestream facilities keep us connected in a special way, but will never replace our physical presence at Mass and the joy of receiving Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

Next weekend (12/13 June) a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Bernard will be read out at all Masses. The Pastoral Letter is focused on the Diocesan Vision: Unfolding God's Plan. The Archbishop will introduce the Vision and how we intend to move forward as an Archdiocese over the coming years. As we make a fresh beginning after more than a year of lockdowns and restrictions, our aim is for clergy and the lay faithful to work closely to create vibrant communities of faith, joyful in their service of God and neighbour. The Letter will be accompanied by a prayer card and will also be available in audio and video format via the diocesan website, for which details will be given next week.

As some of the restrictions are lifted, there are some changes that will begin to happen at Mass. It is important that we are still sensible and maintain social distancing. We will continue with track and trace and wear face coverings in church unless age (younger children) or medical conditions preclude this. **As you approach for Holy Communion the priest will now say to you individually, 'The Body of Christ' to which you are able to reply 'Amen.'**

In the weeks ahead there will be more opportunities to slowly introduce some of the other ministries that support our celebration of Mass. The numbers at church are gradually increasing and we are pleased to see more of the young families returning each week. We continue to pray that despite the uncertainties, life continues to return to some new normality. Have a very good weekend. Best wishes. Fr Long

VISITS TO THE SICK - I have already begun visiting our sick & housebound parishioners. It is hoped that in the next few weeks some of our Eucharistic Ministers who visited the sick can begin this important ministry again if it is safe for them to do so. More details to follow.

SHRINE OF OUR LADY AND THE SACRED HEART - These lamps burn perpetually at the statues of the Sacred Heart and Our Lady of Fatima. Would you like one of these to burn in memory of a loved one, or for a particular intention? If so, we are asking for a donation of £5 per week, which will go towards the costs of running the sacristy: candles, hosts, wine and other necessities for the celebration of Mass. The candles are lit from Monday to Sunday and there are lots of dates available.

QUEEN ELIZABETH AND BIRMINGHAM WOMEN'S HOSPITALS AND ST MARY'S HOSPICE

If you know that you (or a family member or friend in the parish) will be going to hospital for significant treatment, it is important to have confession with anointing of the sick before you/they go into hospital as these sacraments are not presently readily available during your stay. There is a cover rota provided by priests around the area. This is for emergency use only. Such visits are arranged via the hospital so that the priest on call will be allowed admission.

We need more steward to help with welcoming and cleaning our church at 11am Mass. Please speak to Fr Long if you are willing to help with this necessary requirement. Without stewards, it will not be safe to celebrate our Mass.
